With the Boy Scouts of America organization, she has been instrumental in the following activities:

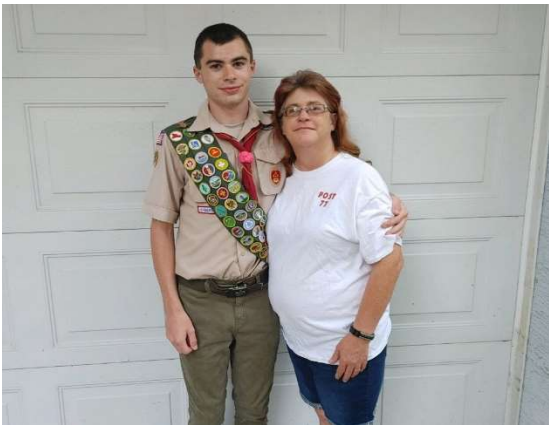
First Aide training, cooking classes to help the young men earn merit badges
